




Nothing is entirely squirrel proof!





A word about feeders and disease



Keep Your Feeders Clean!

Feeders of every type should be thoroughly cleaned a least once a week!

Scrub with soapy water and brush. Rinse well Soak in dilute bleach solution 30 minutes

1 part bleach: 10 parts water

Rinse very well, let air dry

Purchase extra feeders so you always have one clean!

SUET for winter feeding (<70 degrees) lard or peanut butter, seed, nuts, dried fruit









Nectar







Basic Nectar Recipe

No need to buy nectar mixes!

No need for red food coloring!

One part granulated sugar to four parts water

Change every 3 days, more frequently if the nectar gets cloudy!



Proper Placement is Critical Don't Create an Ecological Trap!





Mounting on Metal Pole



Mounting recommendations

North American Bluebird Society

- 8' metal electrical conduit 1" diameter
 - Drive into ground 2' (ideally box is 6' off ground)
 - T post with 4" PVC sleeve or section of downspout
 - Install mounting pole at least 10' from nearest tree
 - Can wax pole to make it slippery
 - Consider adding a predator guard

Maintenance

- Painting exterior is ok (use latexbased)
- Clean out after each brood fledges
 - Flush with 10% bleach solution
 - Check drainage holes
- Check for loose screws, brackets

Let's Make Suet!

Recipe

- 1 cup melted Lard & Crunchy Peanut Butter
- 1 cup Oats
- 1 cup corn meal
- ½ cup wheat flour
- ½ cup seeds of your choice

Refrigerate for 24 hours before putting out or Freeze
